POLICE DEPARTMENT BULLETIN

Regulation of Dogs and Cats

Keeping pets is becoming increasingly popular in households across the country. Recent studies estimate that around 63 percent of all US households (71.1 million) are pet owners, and more than half of those households have more than one animal. The most popular pets are dogs and cats. People keep pets for a variety of reasons including companionship, home security, teaching responsibility and enhancing behavior among children. However, being a pet owner carries with it certain obligations and responsibilities.

Assumptions and misunderstanding of city ordinances surrounding the keeping and maintenance of pets in the city and particularly dogs in public areas, including parks and beaches, has prompted this guide. The Port Washington Police Department and the Park and Recreation Department would like to make it very clear that we encourage and welcome dog owners and their dogs in our city parks and public ways, as long as they abide by the regulations set forth governing their behavior.

To help in understanding what is expected of pet owners when they walk a dog, visit a park, beach or other public area, we have included a summary of the Port Washington "Animal Regulation" ordinances. Please protect yourself, your neighbors and your community by being a considerate and responsible pet owner. The city will take appropriate actions, including the issuance of citations, if necessary, against individuals who do not abide by the regulations governing the keeping of pets within the city.

- **Keeping of Dogs & Cats:** Persons may not keep, maintain, or harbor more than two dogs and two cats in any apartment, residence, household, yard or place of business, except where allowed by the Zoning Ordinances. A time limit of three (3) months is allowed for litters. (Ord. 11.02.120 H.)
- **Licensing:** All dogs and cats in the city are required to be licensed annually. Proof of rabies vaccination is required for licensing. Dog and cat licenses are available at City Hall. (Ord. 11.02.120 B.)
- **Animals at Large:** No person shall permit any animal owned by him or under his control or in his possession to run at large. Owners may not permit dogs or cats to be on any public property in the city or on any private property in the city without the owner's permission, when such animal is not secured by a leash, chain, or rope in control of any person or confined within a fenced enclosure. (Ord. 11.02.120 A.)
- **Fecal Matter:** Owners or persons in control of dogs, cats or other permitted animals are responsible for the immediate removal of fecal material left by their animals on any property other than the owner's. Pet owners or persons in control of such animal(s) may not dispose of any such fecal material on any property other than his or her own property. (Ord. 11.02.120 I.)
- **Barking Dogs:** No person shall harbor any dogs or any other animals within his care or custody which shall continuously bark, or create a continuous or intermittent noise or disturbance, or allow such animals to make any unusual or unnecessary noise to the disturbance of the neighborhood, or to people passing upon the streets or sidewalks. (Ord. 11.02.120 D.)

STREET PROJECTS

In mid-June, work will begin on improvements to the following streets: **Division St.** from Sunset Rd. (CTH CC) to Chestnut St.

Chestnut St. from S. Webster St. to S. Wisconsin St. (including alleys)

- S. Wisconsin St. from Chestnut St. to Grand Ave.
- S. Montgomery St. From Chestnut St. to Dead End.

The projects will include replacement of all water mains and services up to the curb, new storm sewer, and replacement of all curb and pavement. Spot replacement of existing sidewalks and extending the sidewalk south of Western Ave. on the west side of Division St. will also be included. The sanitary sewer will be lined on Division St. south of Oakland Ave. prior to the start of the street project. All work is scheduled to be complete by the end of September.

Concurrent to this work, We Energies will make improvements to extend S. Wisconsin St. from Chestnut St. south to Sunset Rd. The new road is scheduled to be opened to the public shortly after Labor Day.

GARBAGE/RECYCLING COLLECTION

When placing your garbage/recycling carts for collection, please place the carts either on the parkway (between the curb and the sidewalk) or in your driveway approach. Please do not put the carts in the street or on the sidewalk. When carts are placed in the street, it creates problems for street sweepers in the spring and summer, leaf collection equipment in the fall, and snowplows in the winter. When carts are placed on the sidewalk, they make it impossible for people in wheelchairs to pass. Your consideration and cooperation is greatly appreciated.

WATER DEPARTMENT UPDATE

The summer sewer credit program is in place for the four-month period of May 1 – September 1. This credit will be applied to the bills of August 1 and October 1 for all eligible customers. The credit is based on usage during the four-month period of the prior November 1 – March 1.

FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT...

Fire Pits and Outdoor Fireplaces

The fire department receives numerous inquiries regarding the use of outdoor fire pits or fireplaces. For clarity, a "fire pit" includes belowground pits, freestanding fireplaces, and portable devices intended to contain and control outdoor fires.

All belowground fire pits shall be at least four inches in depth and shall be surrounded on the outside, aboveground, by a non-combustible material such as steel, brick, or masonry. The fire pit cannot exceed three feet in diameter, nor may the fire pile exceed two feet in height.

Fire pits may be used in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and these regulations:
Only natural firewood/commercial logs may be burned.

- Burning lumber, pallets, scrap wood, tree trimmings, leaves, yard waste, paper, cardboard, garbage and similar items is not permitted.
- All fire pits must be located away from any structure or combustible material.
- Belowground fire pits and freestanding fireplaces must be located a minimum of 25 feet away from any structure or combustible material.
- Portable fire pits must be located a minimum of 15 feet away from any structure or combustible material.


The fire must be constantly attended and supervised until the fire has been completely extinguished.

A portable fire extinguisher or other approved extinguishing equipment, such as a garden hose, must be readily available.


