### **Center Operations & Procedures**

We encourage our members who **may need** special assistance living on their own to register for events, programs, and trips **with a friend, family member or caregiver to provide the assistance** they may need. Due to the limit of staff, the Center cannot provide one-on-one assistance during the event, class, or trip. Please register with staff so we can be aware of individual needs. **Members who reside in care settings, such as group homes, must attend Senior Center programs with a caregiver.**

**Sign in:** Members and guests must sign in each visit whether once a day, week, month or 2 or 3 different times a day. This is important for the City annual report statistics.

**Regular Center Activities & Special Events:** There are times when a special event or new program is offered that may impact the location of a regular program or its start time. All members' cooperation is appreciated when offering events.

**Membership-** Annual membership is from January to December. **Individual fee is \$17.00 and Couple \$22.00** for City and Town of Port Residents & since 2012 membership the Village of Fredonia!

**Out of town individuals to receive membership the fee is \$37.00 per person or \$64.00 per couple per year, it includes the newsletter and may be paid quarterly; or may subscribe to the newsletter for \$12.00 per year.**

***Non-member weekly fee for guests in town is \$2.00 and out of town \$4.00. All members must assist with the enforcement of the fee paid in the office prior to participation. Value of membership in the Center offers you a place to read the Journal Sentinel, Ozaukee Press, News Graphic, & a variety of magazines saving you money on subscriptions; discounts on classes; and use of laptops and WiFi.***  
**Recyclables** – There is a container on both levels for aluminum cans. The can should be rinsed then deposited in the container. Clean cans are preferred for recycling. Thanks to all who help.



Many people notice changes in their memory, communication or problem solving that they attribute to getting older, fatigue or other health changes. Although that may be true, they may also be signs that someone should consider having a cognitive screening.

Kathy Glaser, the Dementia Care Specialist for Ozaukee County, will be joining us on Wed July 16, to explore discuss signs to pay attention to, why to have a screening, what a screening involves and what happens afterward. Since 1 in 8 people over the age of 65 have some form of dementia, this could affect you, your spouse, sibling or neighbor, so it is good information to have for reference.

Kathy will also be updating us on what the State of Wisconsin is doing to address dementia care, make communities more dementia friendly and support those affected by this disease and their families. 


