# Ozaukee County's Reverse Emergency Notification Alerting System



Residents of Ozaukee County have long known that they may call 9-1-1 for police, fire or medical assistance.

What you may not be aware of is that the Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office, Ozaukee County Public Health Department, and Ozaukee County Emergency Management participate within a mass alert notification system similar to a reverse of the 9-1-1 system. We have the ability to send voice and text-to-text messages that alert the community to a variety of emergency and non-emergency circumstances. Such messages may be community wide or very specific geographically.

The alert notification system is provided by MyStateUSA – AlertSense. Any such system is only as effective as the database of contacts allows. For example, many land line, cell phone telephone numbers and pagers are unpublished or unlisted. Those numbers may not be in the data base and as such you would not receive emergency notification through our system.

MyStateUSA has a simple process in place that enhances our opportunity to contact you via your cell phone, Blackberry, pager and email. We urge you to visit our website at [www.co.ozaukee.wi.us/sheriff](http://www.co.ozaukee.wi.us/sheriff) and enter the portal <https://mystateusa.com/alertSignup.aspx?region=21328>

Please complete the following sections; Basic Information, Select Alerts, Send Message To and Submit. We stress that you provide your unpublished and unlisted land line phones as well as your cell exchange. We also strongly urge that you enter your full address as that information will sync your cell phone exchange with a physical location. Once submitted the information is now added to the database. This information enhances our ability to contact you.

Please note that the information you are adding is confidential and you are not giving permission to private or political solicitation of any kind. Be aware, your standard text messaging rates apply and you may unsubscribe at any time.

The capability to disseminate critical information in a very rapid manner equates to safety for residents and businesses alike. We look forward to serving you.




# TENANT WATER / SEWER BILLS


# WATER / SEWER BILL PAYMENT

## **Alternative Disposal Recommendations**

### **Latex or Water Based Paint.**

If unusable, remove lid and place in a well-ventilated area. After contents have solidified, replace lid and place in the trash. Paint can be dried more quickly by pouring 1/2-inch layer into a cardboard box lined with plastic or newspaper or into a box filled with sand, vermiculite or kitty litter.

### **Drain Oil.**

Used motor oil may be recycled. Bring to the Ozaukee County Highway Department located in Port Washington at 410 South Spring Street or contact your local municipality for further information.

### **Batteries.**

Auto batteries may be traded in or taken to the local battery retailer for recycling. Lead acid batteries may be taken to a battery retailer for recycling. Household batteries may be disposed of in household garbage.

## **Alternative Disposal Recommendations**

**Windshield Washer Solution, Paint Brush Cleaners Containing TSP, Rust Removers, Cleaners Containing Ammonia, Chlorine Bleach, Expired Medical Prescriptions, Rubbing Alcohol, Cosmetics, Nail Polish Remover, Tub/Tile and Shower Cleaners, Disinfectants.**

Small quantities may be flushed down the drain with lots of water.

**Oven Cleaner, Drain Openers, Toilet Bowl Cleaners Containing Sodium Hydroxide or Lye.**

If connected to a municipal sewage system, flush down the drain with lots of water. Rinse the empty container before placing in the trash and be careful not to get the rinse water on your hands.

## **Hearing Aid Batteries**

These often contain mercury or silver. After a number have accumulated, drop them off at a hospital or a hearing aid center for recycling.

# **Alternative Disposal Recommendations**

## **Auto Body Filler, Ceramic Glaze, Fiberglass and Epoxy Resins, Shoe and Nail Polish.**

These may be solidified and placed in the trash.

## **Computers**

The Volunteer Center of Ozaukee County recycles computers and cell phones 3 times a year.

**NEVER** dump leftover products in a backyard or on the ground.

**NEVER** reuse pesticide or other chemical containers for other purposes.

**NEVER** burn or bury leftover products.

**NEVER** mix chemical wastes.

**ALWAYS** read product labels and follow use directions.

**ALWAYS** keep these products out of the reach of children.

**TRY** sharing unused product with others who may have a need.

**TRY** buying just enough product to do the job.

**TRY** substituting a non-hazardous product.

## ***RECYCLING INSTRUCTIONS***

### **Recycling Rules IF NOT USING CARTS:**

- Place **BLUE** or **CLEAR** recycling bag and recycling bundles at the curb by 7:00 AM on your collection day.
- Glass, plastic, aluminum and bi-metal containers shall **mixed together** in a **BLUE** or **CLEAR** recycling bag that can be purchased at retail outlets in Port Washington.
- Newspapers, magazines, and corrugated cardboard will be tied in bundles and placed curbside, adjacent to the **BLUE** or **CLEAR** recycling bag.

## **Recycling Collection Schedule**

The City is now collecting recyclables every other week. Collection is made on the same day as your garbage collection. Garbage and Recyclables **must be** placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection, but **may not** be set out prior to 6 p.m. on the evening before collection.

# Garbage & Recycling Update

## If Residents are not using Carts:

Residential garbage shall be placed in plastic disposable bags not greater than 30 gallons in size or 50 lbs in weight. Rugs, carpeting, vinyl flooring, etc., must be tied in bundles and be less than 5 feet in length and 50 lbs in weight. Small furniture (3' x 5' or smaller) is acceptable, as are small appliances such as toasters, radios, televisions etc. Small amounts of stone rubble, lumber, etc. will be taken if it is in a container, bag, or bundle not exceeding 32 gallons in size or 50 lbs in weight. Special pick-ups for larger items, appliances, etc., can be arranged by calling Advanced Disposal at 1-800-387-0949.

# Garbage & Recycling Update

## If Residents are not using Carts:

Recyclables shall be placed in blue or clear recycling bags and include:

Plastic containers #1 and #2, Aluminum Cans, Bi-metal/tin cans, glass bottles and jars. Magazines, newspapers, and corrugated cardboard shall be bagged or bundled. Cardboard shall be cut down to sizes not greater than 3' x 3'. Maximum bundle size is 8 inches deep. City ordinance requires that all garbage and recycling items be placed on the curb no earlier than the evening prior to collection.



# **NEW PARKING FINES**

Parking forfeitures for all parking violations in the City of Port Washington shall be \$10 if paid within 72 hours of the violation. This is an increase of \$5 for parking violations that occur within a city parking lot. The parking forfeiture increases to \$15 if paid after 72 hours and within 10 days; \$20 if paid after ten days and within 28 days, \$35 if paid after 28 days. Forfeiture for a violation related to parking spaces on portions of streets, highways, or parking facilities reserved for vehicles used by physically disabled persons shall be not less than \$50 or more than \$300. These parking forfeiture rates are effective as of December 10, 2009.

Parking restrictions on N. Franklin Street and E. Grand Avenue have been amended from 1-hour parking limits to 2-hour parking limits. This change in the parking restrictions is effective December 10, 2009.

# Temporary License Plates

Temporary registration plates for motor vehicles are now available at the Port Washington Police Department located at 365 North Wisconsin Street.
