The City of Port Washington is proposing to improve the following streets in 2016:

Lincoln Avenue:	Portview Dr. – Spring St.
Tower Drive:	Second Ave. – Grand Ave.
Larabee Street:	Spring St. – West end
Woodland Avenue:	Garfield Ave. – Cul de sac
Norport Drive:	Grant St. – Holden St.
Holden Street:	James Dr. – Norport Dr.
James Dr.:	Holden St. – Benjamin St.
Theis Street:	Theis Lane – Benjamin St.
Theis Lane	Theis St. – James Dr.
Benjamin Street:	Norport Dr. – Beutel Rd.

The proposed project consists of reconstructing or resurfacing the existing roadway, spot replacement of existing sidewalk, construction of new sidewalk where it is currently absent, water main replacement, and storm and sanitary sewer improvements. No right-of-way acquisition is anticipated. There will be no special assessments with the exception of new (not replacement) sidewalk located on a property's front side. Additionally, homeowners interested in replacing their sanitary sewer lateral or constructing a new storm sewer connection as part of this project may arrange to do so at their expense by contacting the City Engineer. These streets will be closed to through-traffic during construction, and homeowners will be notified of the construction schedule once it becomes available.

All persons interested in this project are encouraged to attend a **Public Information Meeting on Tuesday, November 3, 2015. The meeting will be held from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. in the upper level of City Hall, 100 West Grand Avenue.** The meeting will be conducted in an open house format. No public presentation will be made. The facility is wheelchair accessible.

(design consultant) will be available to explain the proposed improvements while gathering information and listening to any questions or concerns of those in attendance.
