# MINUTES CITY OF PORT WASHINGTON CITY COUNCIL MEETING May 20, 2008

- B. Update On Projects
  - 1. Highway 32 Project Franklin Street is in the home stretch. All crosswalks should be completed by the end of this week; street scaping, concrete, tree planters next week. As far as the sidewalk, realistically, it's unlikely that it will be 100% complete next week even though the contractor is adding more people to work on the installation of the pavers, which is very time consuming. Phase 2 of the project will begin June 2<sup>nd</sup> from Jackson Street north to Walters street.
  - 2. Harborwalk Grand opening of completion of the Harborwalk will be held on Tuesday, June 3 at 7:00 p.m. with a ribbon cutting ceremony at the southwest corner of Rotary Park.
  - 3. Beutel Road Project Coming along well. The Water Utility has done an outstanding job of keeping people notified when water breaks occurred during the project. Contractor is working on the storm sewer and street construction is scheduled for next week.

  THE EXISTING STORM SEWER, AND NOTIFY THE SIX OR MORE
  RESIDENTS WHO HAVE NOT REQUESTED TO CONNECT TO THE
  STORM SEWER THAT THEY ARE NOW REQUIRED TO CONNECT
  AND BE INCLUDED IN THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR THE
  BEUTEL/LAKEVIEW/WILSON PROJECT. Motion carried
  unanimously.
- 2. Consider Amendment #4 For State Highway 33 Project Contract City Engineer Vanden Noven indicated that this amendment is to include the design of 2 roundabouts at the Northwoods and Market St. intersections on Highway 33 to keep the project on schedule. He met with Saukville officials and they are not raising objections to it, but request another future amendment with more specifics for design and financial issues of their roundabouts and work on a Memorandum of Understanding with the DOT on final components of the project. MOTION BY ALDERMAN HUDSON, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN ROSS TO APPROVE AMENDMENT #4 FOR THE STATE HIGHWAY 33 CONTRACT. Motion carried unanimously.
- 3. Consider Temporary Lighting For Phase 2 Of The STH 32 Improvements MOTION BY ALDERMAN HUDSON, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN VOLLMAR TO APPROVE TEMPORARY LIGHTING FOR PHASE 2 OF THE STH32 PROJECT AT A TIME AND MATERIAL NOT TO EXCEED \$7,500 BY WESTER ELECTRIC. Motion carried unanimously.
- 4. Consider Hiring Engineering Firm To Manage The Design/Construction Of Septage Receiving Station MOTION BY ALDERMAN ROSS, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN HAACKE TO APPROVE DONAHUE & ASSOCIATES FOR \$18,976 FOR THE SURVEYING, DESIGN, AND BIDDING PROCESS FOR THE SEPTAGE RECEIVING STATION UPGRADE. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **B.** Plan Commission

- Public Hearing For The Rezoning Of Property Located In The 200 Block Of N. Park St. (Habitat For Humanity) – Mayor Huebner declared open the public hearing. MOTION BY ALDERMAN HAACKE, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN HUDSON TO CLOSE THE PUBLIC HEARING. <u>Motion</u> <u>carried unanimously</u>.
- 2. Ordinance 2008-6 (Rezoning Of Habitat For Humanity Property On N. Park St. From PUL (Public Lands) To CCM (Central City Mixed With OPD Planned Development Zoning) 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading City Attorney Eberhardt asked about the proposed paved area for visitor parking and said that the boundary of the area to be rezoned subject to the overlay should be defined by legal description. He recommended to table approval of the ordinance subject to a new legal description. Alderman Haacke said that to facilitate the process of moving this ahead that it be approved as shown in the shaded area and readdress the issue of two additional parking spaces at a future date. MOTION BY ALDERMAN HAACKE, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN NEUMYER TO APPROVE ORDINANCE 2008-6. Motion carried unanimously.
- 3. Extraterritorial Review Of Final Plat Of The Ledgestone Subdivision, Town Of Port Washington, Bielinski Homes, Applicant MOTION BY ALDERMAN NEUMYER, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN HUDSON TO APPROVE THE FINAL PLAT OF THE LEDGESTONE SUBDIVISION, TOWN OF PORT WASHINGTON PER OUR BORDER AGREEMENT.
- 4. Ordinance 2008-9 (Amending 15.06.050 Of The Municipal Code Regarding Permits For Razing Buildings) 1<sup>st</sup> Reading – City Administrator Grams reviewed the proposed ordinance regarding permits for demolition of buildings, including historic buildings. Alderman Hudson suggested that we send the proposed ordinance to the Port Washington Historical Society to get their input.

Mayor Huebner said he was in receipt of a donation of \$150 from Pirate's Fest for the Harborwalk and publicly thanked Kimberly McCulloch. Alderman Vollmar asked what was going to be the replacement for the Fish Day Parade this year. City Administrator Grams reported that Port Fish Day announced that it would feature Disney's High School Musical and Marching Unit Showcase Extravaganza at the Main Stage area, as well as several marching bands participating in the event.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS/APPEARANCES** – Kimberly McCulloch – She expressed her thanks to the City by waiving the docking fee, which helped them get the ship in for Pirate's Fest. She said to come down and see us for the festival. They will have about 75 vendors participating in the event.

**MOTION WAS MADE BY ALDERMAN HUDSON, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN VOLLMAR TO GO INTO CLOSED SESSION** According to Wisconsin State Statute 19.85 (1) (c) (g) to review employee evaluation and discuss employee compensation and to confer with legal counsel in regards to litigation the City may become involved.
