FINANCE AND LICENSE COMMITTEE MEETING
Tuesday, December 18, 2012, 6:30 P.M.

1. Roll Call- Members present, Aldermen Dave Larson, Joe Dean and Doug Biggs. Also present City Attorney Eric Eberhardt, Police Chief Kevin Hingiss, City Administrator Mark Grams and Troy Koput.
2. Approve Minutes Of Previous Meeting- Motion made by Alderman Biggs, seconded by Alderman Larson to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
3. Consider Original Operator License Applications- Motion made by Alderman Biggs, seconded by Alderman Dean to recommend approval of Original Operator Licenses for Amanda Cabrices and Cindy Kinzel. Motion carried unanimously.
4. Consider Original Class B Combination Alcohol License Application For Deville's LLC- The City Attorney reviewed the procedures the Committee must follow in reviewing Mr. Koput's license application. The Committee members asked Mr. Koput about his business plan of operation. The Committee was concerned about him not having his business plan to present. The City Administrator reported that there is still a few building code violations that must be corrected. Following a discussion, motion made by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Biggs to recommend that the Common Council deny Deville LLC alcohol license application at 219 N. Franklin Street on the grounds of incompatibility with downtown area redevelopment plans, the proximity to existing redeveloped or to be developed properties, past conduct of bar patrons at this particular location, and uncorrected code violations and conditions. Motion carried unanimously.
5. Consider Original Annual Cabaret License Application For Deville's LLC- Motion made by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Biggs to recommend denial of the Annual Cabaret License for Deville's LLC. Motion carried unanimously.
