If you have any questions, please call the Department of Public Works at 262-284-2600. Please do not put your garbage or recycling at the curb any earlier than the night before your pickup. **Please do not place carts in the street.**

**Trash Days are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday unless there is a Holiday.**

# CITY OF PORT WASHINGTON REFUSE AND RECYCLING

**CREATING A CLEANER, HEALTHIER COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENT  
THROUGH PROPER WASTE HANDLING, REDUCTION, RECYCLING, REUSE.  
(SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING) RECYCLING WILL BE BI-WEEKLY  
PLEASE SEE ATTACHED GARBAGE & RECYCLING CALENDAR.**

The City provides each residential unit **one cart** for refuse and **one cart** for recycling. The City's contractor (Advanced Disposal) will service only one refuse cart each week and one recycling cart every two weeks. The following information will help guide you through the proper way to manage your refuse/waste – the Do's, the Don'ts.

## **REFUSE - DO'S**

- It is optional to place household/kitchen refuse/waste in bags; however, carts will remain cleaner longer if a bag is used and less debris will blow out of the cart when emptied.
- Reduce the amount of refuse/waste you generate
  - buy in bulk when possible
  - use refillable and reusable products
  - by concentrates to reduce packaging
  - use cloth towels and not paper
  - bring your own bags to stores
  - sell or donate used goods such as clothing, furniture and toys to thrift shops, daycares, charity or second-hand stores
- ashes, sawdust, construction dust, vacuum cleaner dust, etc. should be bagged, sealed and placed in the refuse cart
- cardboard or paper contaminated by oil, grease, or food shall be placed in the refuse cart
- bulk waste, such as furniture, rolled carpeting, fixtures, microwaves, lumber, etc will be collected as long as it fits in the container
- construction waste will be collected provided the resident performed their own work and the materials are placed in the cart and do not prevent the lid from being closed
- paint cans must be in a dry or hardened state, you may add floor-dry or kitty litter
- **place your cart on the end of your driveway (in line with the mailbox) and more than 3' from any post, mailbox, recycling cart, or other object**
- **cart must face the road as indicated by the arrow on the cart**
- **carts must be fully accessible, 3' apart. they cannot be blocked by parked vehicles or any other object**

- all containers must be curbside by 7 AM on the scheduled collection day, **DO NOT** place your cart out earlier than 7 PM the day prior to pick up or after snow plowing

## **REFUSE - DON'TS**

- **do not place electronics such as TV's, Monitors, Cell Phones, etc in refuse cart**
- do not place recyclables in the refuse cart
- do not place yard waste in the refuse cart
- do not place engine oils, anti-freeze, or any other liquid in the refuse cart
- do not place any batteries, fluorescent tubes /bulbs or thermostats in the refuse cart
- do not place any hazardous or medical supplies or medications in the refuse cart
- do not place explosive material/ammunition in the refuse cart
- do not place cart in roadway or on snow banks
- **do not place anything outside the cart – it will not be picked up**

For a bulk pickup of any larger item, please call 1-800-387-0949 – There will be an additional fee.

Large items can also be taken to West Bend Transfer Station, 803 N River Road, West Bend, for a nominal fee. Monday thru Friday; 7:00 to 3:00; 1-800-387-0949.

### Holiday Refuse/Recycling Collection:

If the following holidays fall on a weekday, collection will be one day late after the holiday for the remainder of the week. See the yearly Recycling Calendar. **New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4<sup>th</sup>, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day**



### Appliances and Furniture:

Large appliances, microwaves, TV's and stereos in wooden consoles, and large furniture shall be a special pick-up. Call **Advanced Disposal at 1-800-387-0949 or Ozaukee Iron & Metal** to schedule a pick-up. Try to sell some of these items first through store postings or ad's, or recycle and give to refinishers, second hand/thrift stores, or charities. College students need furniture for their apartments – list free for pick-up at the colleges.



### Building Material (major projects):

Debris from major remodeling, construction projects or work done by contractors **will not be collected**. Removal of this material is the property owner's responsibility. You may call Advanced Disposal to rent large containers or Ozaukee Iron & Metal.



### Household Hazardous Waste/ Flammable Liquids/Chemicals: Port Washington

Residents may drop off most items at no charge at Veolia Special Services at 1-800-556-5267



### Paint and Related Products:

Liquid - paint, varnish, stains, thinner/ stripper, etc. will not be collected. Call Veolia Special Services at 1-800-556-5267. Open cans of dried or hard paint can be put in the refuse cart. If the can has a small amount of liquid, use oil dry or kitty litter.



### Waste Motor Oil:

Waste motor oil may not be placed in the trash container. Oil may be taken to The City Street Department between the months of April - December for no charge (262-284-2600), or the Ozaukee Cty. Hwy. Dept. (262-284-9411).



### Cooking Oil:

(turkey deep fryer units) Mix oil with floor dry or cat litter until all liquid is absorbed. Store in a double bag, seal, and place in the refuse cart.



### Vehicle Batteries:

Will not be picked up. Batteries may be dropped off at **Veolia Special Services**, or at

**Tires Unlimited** (262-284-4414). **Ozaukee Iron & Metal** also accepts them (262-284-4060).



**Propane/Gas Containers:** will not be collected roadside. **Ozaukee Iron & Metal** accepts them (262-284-4060).



**Fluorescent Tube/Bulbs and Thermostats:** will not be collected. Veolia Special Services has a location in Port Washington and will accept them. 1-800-556-5267. Please place in a sealed double bag in case of breakage.



### Auto/Truck Tires:

Will not be collected roadside. Worn tires may be taken to **Tires Unlimited** for a minimal fee (262-284-4414) or **Ozaukee Iron & Metal** (262-284-4060).



### Brush and Leaf Collection:

Brush collection is made bi-weekly from April 15 – May 31, weekly from June 10 – August 30, and bi-weekly from September 9 – October 25. Brush will be accepted at the Street Yard from October 29 – December 7. Brush shall consist of all “woody” material, maximum 8 inches in diameter. Place brush (cut ends with the flow of traffic) at roadside. **Brush and logs cut by a contractor must be disposed of by the contractor.** Leaves may be raked into the street October 7 – December 1 only, weather permitting. Leaves can be bagged at taken to the Street Yard until December 7.

### Holiday Decorations and Christmas

**Trees:** Wreaths and garland are considered refuse and are to be placed in the refuse cart. Christmas trees will be collected curbside by the DPW several times in the **month of January**. **Do Not Leave the tree stands, light strings, ornaments, and tree bags on the trees.**

**IT'S NOT JUST WASTE, IT'S A NATURAL RESOURCE**



Recycling can reduce your household garbage and save resources. It is also very costly to expand and create new landfills. But what goes in your recycling cart? Figuring out what you can and cannot recycle can be downright confusing. There are some basics that will make recycling convenient and reduce your environmental impact.

- Flatten boxes, bulky containers and aluminum cans.
- Play by the recycling rules. They aren't in place to keep the carts spick-and-span, there's a bigger purpose. Broken glass or wet cardboard can clog processing machines. Paper goods with food residue, like last night's greasy pizza box, can contaminate an entire bale of paper.

## RECYCLING The DO'S, the DON'TS



### GLASS

**DO RECYCLE** unbroken glass containers such as applesauce jars, ketchup bottles, perfume bottles, wine and beer bottles. Clear, Green, & Brown.

**DON'T RECYCLE** windows, mirrors, light bulbs and tubes, Pyrex and dishes, drinking glasses, chemical bottles, medial container, and laboratory glass.

**YOUR GLASS** becomes food containers, tiles, landscaping pebbles and road surfacing.



### PAPER

**DO RECYCLE** newspapers, magazines, cardboard and mixed papers such as corrugated boxes, cereal boxes, egg cartons, junk mail, envelopes, catalogs, telephones books, hard-covered books, soft-covered books, plain gift-wrap, books and stapled paper. Go to Direct Marketing Assoc. [www.dmachoice.org/consumerassistance.php](http://www.dmachoice.org/consumerassistance.php) to get yourself off mailing lists to reduce your mail.

**DON'T RECYCLE** bathroom waste paper (towels, toilet paper), food-stained papers, foil or glitter gift wrap, carbon paper, cellophane, cloth, cork, foil, polystyrene Styrofoam, stickers, wet paper products, and those containing plastic, wax or metal foil coatings. Remove hot melt glue used to attach ads to the front of phone books and magazines.

**YOUR PAPER** becomes newsprint, boxes, insulation and animal bedding. One Sunday paper recycled each month saves a tree a year.



### METAL

**DO RECYCLE** aluminum and steel (which includes tin) in the form of beverage and food cans.

**DON'T RECYCLE** contaminated foil wrap, pop tops and other metals curbside. Instead, donate to charity usable items such as flatware, can openers and tools. Call a scrap metal company for heavy loads such as house siding, and gutters.

**YOUR ALUMINUM** becomes beverage cans, cookware, bike parts, and tennis rackets; old steel becomes new steel and may wind up as filing cabinets, auto parts, or appliances.



### PLASTICS (1 thru 7)

**DO RECYCLE** all bottles and rigid containers, for example: beverage bottles, milk jugs, dish and laundry detergent bottles, and peanut butter jars, grocery bags (if not returned to store), shrink wrap, caps. (Note: If there is not a recycling market for any type of plastic – it still will not go to our landfill)

**DON'T RECYCLE** spray nozzles and pumps, foam packaging (note: some packing peanuts are cornstarch base and dissolve in water). Donate usable items such as toys.

**YOUR PLASTIC** turns into beverage and shampoo bottles, fleece, pipes, fencing, deck planks and gutters, refuse & recycling carts. Recycling five soda bottles yields enough material for one square foot of carpet or fiberfill for a ski jacket.



### COMPUTERS, Televisions, and Electronics Recycling:

Electronics can be recycled at the following places: Best Buy, Milwaukee PC, Veolia ES Technical Solution (262-243-8900) and Ozaukee Iron and Metal (262-284-4060) in Port Washington.

**YOUR ELECTRONICS** are processed for plastics and metals. Many electronics have hazardous metals that are banned from landfills.

# CITY BRUSH COLLECTION POLICY

## Brush Policy for 2019

Brush piles that are estimated to exceed 15 minutes of chipping will be eligible to be disposed of by “hauling away”. For example, brush in the parkway that is stacked 5 feet high and longer than 15 feet.

It is important to properly stack brush with butt ends facing the curb in the direction of traffic and to separate logs and brush. If possible, stack brush in smaller individual piles that will allow for “grab and go” in order to be carried to the chipper. If eligible for “hauling away” you will be notified with a letter informing you that you will be charged before the work is performed and a bill will be sent. We will do our best to not charge and assist in informing of the proper way to stack brush so we can be more efficient.

The charge rate is \$60 if “hailed away”. All normal chipping is still free. Also, if you have smaller piles that can be put in containers for an example; clear bags, small box, or plastic tubs, it would be much appreciated to make the process more efficient.

Separate logs and brush into two distinct piles for easier pickup. For those residents who have smaller terraces or no terraces at all, please place brush in your front yard parallel to the sidewalk. **Also, if you have a contractor remove a tree, direct the contractor to take or chip the branches.**

## Brush and Leaf Collection:

Brush collection is made bi-weekly from April 15 – May 31, weekly from June 10 – August 30, and bi-weekly from September 9 – October 25. Brush will be accepted at the Street Yard from October 25 – December 1.

Brush shall consist of all “woody” material, maximum 8 inches in diameter. Place brush (cut ends with the flow of traffic) at roadside. The brush pile should be

no higher than 3 feet in height for pick up. Please place small piles of brush and twigs into a container (such as a small clear plastic bag or small box) for a quicker disposal.

**Brush and logs cut by a contractor must be disposed of by the contractor.**

**Leaves may be raked into the street October 7 – November 26 only, weather permitting. Leaves can be bagged and taken to the Street Yard until December 7.**

### **Holiday Decorations and Christmas Trees:**

Wreaths and garland are considered refuse and are to be placed in the refuse cart. Christmas trees will be collected curbside by the DPW several times in the **month of January**. **Do Not Leave the tree stands, light strings, ornaments, and/ or tree bags on the trees.**

## ***Five easy payment options for your water/sewer bill***

Your water/sewer bill is a postcard and mailed to you the first week of every even numbered month (February, April, June, August, October and December). Meters are read every odd numbered month. Payment is due the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month you receive your bill.

*Payment can be made several convenient - and cost effective - ways!*

- (1) Pay online! Link to Payment Services Network from the City website at [www.cityofportwashington.com](http://www.cityofportwashington.com) or call them at 877-885-7968. You can pay with your credit card for a 2.75% convenience fee or with an e-check for no additional charge.
- (2) Stop at City Hall in the finance office and sign up to have all your water and sewer bills automatically deducted from your checking or savings account. You still receive your bill in the mail, marked "Do not pay, paid by ACH" and payment is deducted from your designated account on the due date.
- (3) Three local banks partner with the City for payment collection. They DO require the payment stub from your bill and DO NOT accept payments after the due date. See Associated, BMO Harris, or Port Washington State banks. (You do not need to have an account there to make a payment!)
- (4) Drop off your check and payment stub at City Hall. Please attach them with staple, paper clip, or in an envelope. Drop boxes for payments are located in the alley behind City Hall (accessible 24/7) and in the lobby of the upper level of City Hall (8am to 5pm, Monday through Friday). These boxes are locked for your security and checked by utility billing staff at 8am and 5pm every business day. Though the drop boxes are locked, we ask that you NOT leave cash.
- (5) Mail your check and the payment stub of your bill to us at PO Box 307! The address is on the back of your postcard bill. Please include "WATER & SEWER" on your envelope.


